Low Gain mode is available, controlled by integrated CMOS logic circuit.

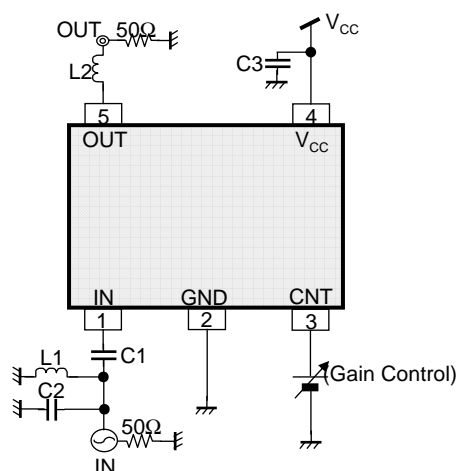

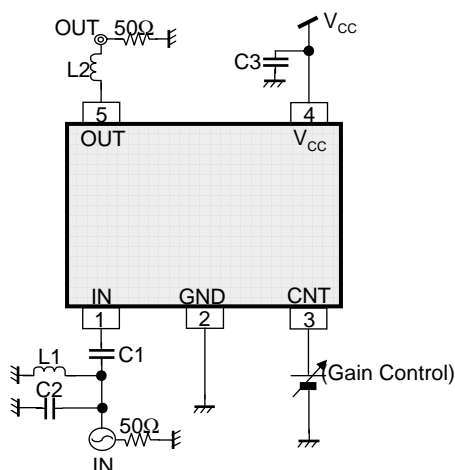

TOP VIEW

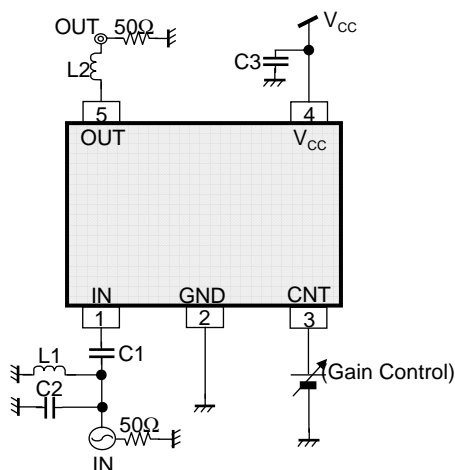

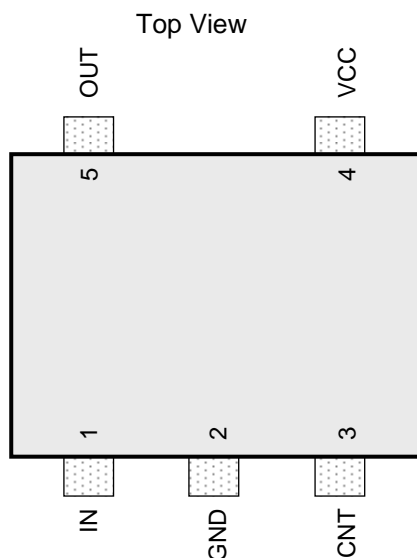

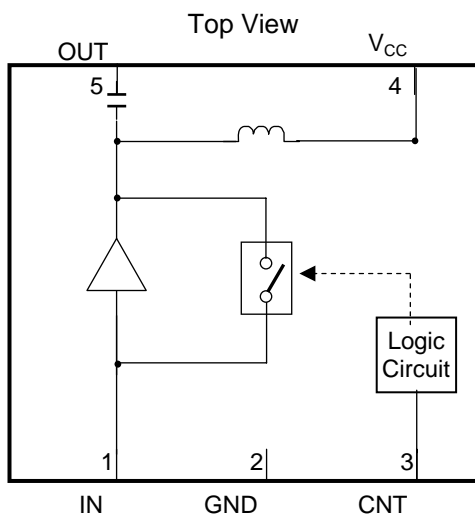

## FUNCTIONAL BLOCK DIAGRAM

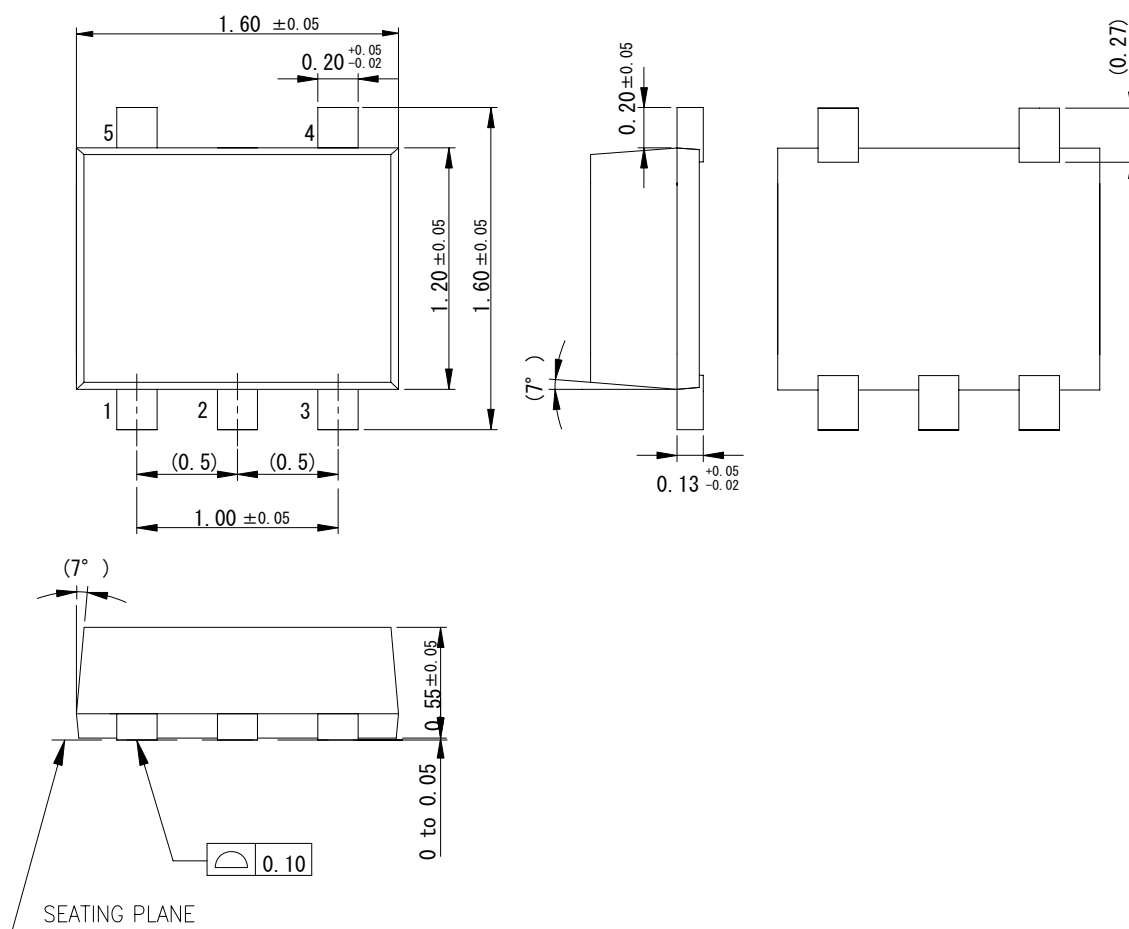
