DESCRIPTION

The PS9324L and PS9324L2 are optical coupled high-speed, active low type isolators containing a GaAlAs LED on the input side and a photodiode and a signal processing circuit on the output side on one chip.

The PS9324L is lead bending type (Gull-wing) for surface mounting.

The PS9324L2 is lead bending type for long creepage distance (Gull-wing) for surface mount.








PACKAGE DIMENSIONS (UNIT: mm)


Lead Bending Type (Gull-wing) For Surface Mount




Lead Bending Type (Gull-wing) For Long Creepage Distance (Surface Mount)





*2. Test circuit for propagation delay time





*3. Test circuit for switching time





*4. Test circuit for common mode transient immunity








LOW LEVEL OUTPUT VOLTAGE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE



THRESHOLD INPUT CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




PROPAGATION DELAY TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




LOW LEVEL OUTPUT VOLTAGE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




THRESHOLD INPUT CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




PROPAGATION DELAY TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




PULSE WIDTH DISTORTION vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE



PROPAGATION DELAY TIME vs. FORWARD CURRENT




SWITCHING TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




PULSE WIDTH DISTORTION vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




PROPAGATION DELAY TIME vs. FORWARD CURRENT




SWITCHING TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




TAPING SPECIFICATIONS (UNIT: mm)



Avoid removing the residual flux with freon-based and chlorine-based cleaning solvent.

2. Cautions regarding noise

Be aware that when voltage is applied suddenly between the photocoupler's input and output or between collectoremitters at startup, the output side may enter the on state, even if the voltage is within the absolute maximum ratings.

USAGE CAUTIONS

- 1. This product is weak for static electricity by designed with high-speed integrated circuit so protect against static electricity when handling.
- 2. By-pass capacitor of more than $0.1 \,\mu\text{F}$ is used between Vcc and GND near device. Also, ensure that the distance between the leads of the photocoupler and capacitor is no more than $10 \, \text{mm}$.
- 3. When V_{DD} is lower than around 2 V, the output(V_O) of this product is unstable, and this might produce undesirable operation. Be sure to check the operation of an IC or a discrete component that is connected to this product during Power-up and Power-down process. And we recommend to use a disable function (shutdown function) of the connected IC or a reset IC to avoid this undesirable operation.
- **4.** Pin 2 (which is an NC^{*1} pin) can either be connected directly to the GND pin on the LED side or left open. Unconnected pins should not be used as a bypass for signals or for any other similar purpose because this may degrade the internal noise environment of the device.
 - Note: *1. NC: Non-Connection (No Connection).
- 5. Avoid storage at a high temperature and high humidity.
